A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Branches of County Government – Executive Branch –
2 Reorganization – Office of Transportation – Public Ethics – Transportation Officer

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4 FOR the purpose of creating an Office of Transportation; designating the Transportation
5 Officer as the office head, appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the County
6 Executive; providing for the duties of the Office of Transportation; providing for the
7 qualifications of the Transportation Officer; requiring the Transportation Officer to file
8 financial disclosure statements as required under the Ethics Article; providing for the
9 applicability of this Ordinance; and generally relating to the executive branch of
10 County government and public ethics.

ARTICLE 2. BRANCHES OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT

TITLE 1. EXECUTIVE BRANCH

2-1-103. Offices and departments.

(a) **Offices in Executive Branch.** There are the following offices in the Executive Branch:

(10) Office of Personnel; [[and]]

(11) Office of Planning and Zoning[.]; AND

(12) OFFICE OF TRANSPORTATION.

2-1-401. Duties of offices and departments.

The Offices of Administrative Hearings, Budget, Central Services, Finance, Information Technology, Law, Personnel, [[and]] Planning and Zoning, AND TRANSPORTATION, and the Departments of Aging and Disabilities, Detention Facilities, Fire, Inspections and Permits, Police, Public Works, and Recreation and Parks have the authority, duties, responsibilities, and functions prescribed in the Charter and this Code.

2-1-402. Office and department heads.

The Administrative Hearing Officer, Budget Officer, Central Services Officer, Controller, Information Technology Officer, County Attorney, Personnel Officer, Planning and Zoning Officer, TRANSPORTATION OFFICER, Director of Aging and Disabilities, Superintendent of Detention Facilities, Fire Chief, Director of Inspections and Permits, Chief of Police, Director of Public Works, and Director of Recreation and Parks are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the County Executive. They shall possess the qualifications required by the Charter and this Code and be appointed solely on the basis of their qualifications for performing the duties of office.

2-1-506. Office of Transportation.

(A) **Office.** THERE IS AN OFFICE OF TRANSPORTATION IN THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH.

(B) **Duties.** THE OFFICE OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION MOBILITY AND PLANNING SERVICES TO PROMOTE A MULTI-MODAL TRANSPORTATION NETWORK THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY AND SHALL PERFORM OTHER TRANSPORTATION RELATED DUTIES AS PERIODICALLY ASSIGNED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE.

(C) **Officer.**

(1) THE OFFICE OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL BE ADMINISTERED BY THE TRANSPORTATION OFFICER.

(2) THE TRANSPORTATION OFFICER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE ON THE BASIS OF KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE IN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ASPECTS OF TRANSIT, AS WELL AS THE OPERATION OF PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEMS.

(3) THE TRANSPORTATION OFFICER SHALL REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER.

ARTICLE 7 PUBLIC ETHICS

TITLE 6. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

7-6-101. Persons required to file statements.

(A) **Generally.** Any and all individuals in the following chart shall file with the Ethics Commission the statements provided for in this Title:

EXECUTIVE BRANCH

[[Transit]] TRANSPORTATION Officer

SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
