ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

County Charter – Baltimore County Farmland Preservation Act

FOR the purpose of amending the County Charter to state that any changes, revisions, or amendments to the boundaries of the Urban-Rural Demarcation Line (URDL) shall require approval by a certain threshold of affirmative votes of the County Council; amending the County Charter to clarify that, except for consideration of the boundaries of the URDL, other matters such as a plan, zoning map, rule, or regulation that was recommended for adoption, amendment, or repeal by the department of planning, the planning board, or the zoning commissioner shall be approved by a simple majority of a legislative act of the County Council; amending the definition of the URDL in the Zoning Regulations, contingent upon the passage and ratification of the Charter amendments by the voters of

Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that under the authority granted to it by Section 1202 of the Baltimore
3 County Charter, Section 1014 of Article X – Miscellaneous of the Baltimore County Charter, is
4 proposed to be added and Section 522.1 of Article V – The Administrative Services of the
5 Baltimore County Charter, is proposed to be repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, and to
6 read as follows:

8 Article V – The Administrative Services

9 Division 3 – Departments in the Administrative Services

10 Subdivision 1 – Department of Planning

1 Section 522.1. Duties of the department of planning; limitation of powers.

2 (a) The department of planning shall have the responsibility and duty of planning for
3 Baltimore County, including:

4 (1) Preparing, at least every ten years, and revising, a master plan; monitoring the
5 implementation of the master plan; and preparing at least every two years a report to the county
6 executive and county council on the progress achieved toward implementation of the master
7 plan.

8 (2) Preparing, at least every six years, recommending to the county council, and
9 administering, a zoning map.

10 (3) Preparing and recommending to the county council rules and regulations
11 governing the subdivision of land, and administering the subdivision rules and regulations as
12 adopted.

13 (4) Preparing and recommending to the county council zoning rules and
14 regulations which, together with the zoning map, shall constitute a zoning code.

15 (5) Administering the zoning code.

16 (b) (1) The master plan shall be adopted as provided by section 523 of this Charter.

17 (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 1014 OF THIS CHARTER, ~~All~~
18 ALL other plans, zoning maps, and rules and regulations recommended for adoption,
19 amendment, or repeal by the department of planning, the planning board or the zoning
20 commissioner shall, prior to taking effect as law, be approved by legislative act of the county
21 council.

2 SECTION 1014. URBAN-RURAL DEMARCATION LINE.

3 ANY CHANGES, REVISIONS, OR AMENDMENTS TO THE BOUNDARIES OF
4 THE URBAN-RURAL DEMARCATION LINE (URDL) SHALL REQUIRE THE
5 RECOMMENDATION OF THE PLANNING BOARD AND APPROVAL BY THE
6 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY PLUS ONE OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF
7 COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBERS ESTABLISHED BY THIS CHARTER,~~INCLUDING THE~~
8 ~~AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBER OR MEMBERS IN WHOSE~~
9 ~~DISTRICT THE CHANGE, REVISION, OR AMENDMENT IS LOCATED.~~

11 SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
12 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations read as follows:

14 Article 1 – General Provisions

15 Section 101 – Definitions

16
17 § 101.1. Word usage; definitions.

18 Words used in the present tense include the future; words in the singular number include
19 the plural number; the word “shall” is mandatory. For the purposes of these regulations, certain
20 terms and words are defined below.

21 Any word or term not defined in this section shall have the ordinarily accepted definition
22 as set forth in the most recent edition of Webster’s Third New International Dictionary of the
23 English Language, Unabridged.

1 URBAN-RURAL DEMARCATION LINE – A boundary line established by the
2 Planning Board, dividing that portion of Baltimore County considered as “urban” from that
3 portion of the county considered as “rural.” In ~~establishing or relocating such line,~~
4 RECOMMENDING ANY CHANGES, REVISIONS, OR AMENDMENTS TO THE
5 BOUNDARIES OF THE URBAN-RURAL DEMARCATION LINE UNDER SECTION 1014
6 OF THE CHARTER, the Planning Board shall consider population density, existing public water
7 supply and sewerage facilities, other existing public facilities and public facilities scheduled for
8 planning or construction in the capital budget and five-year capital program.

9
10 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that pursuant to Section 1202 of
11 the Baltimore County Charter, the question of whether or not the Charter is to be amended as
12 proposed by this Act shall be submitted to the voters of Baltimore County at the general election
13 on November 3, 2026, and that this Act shall be published in at least two newspapers of general
14 circulation in the County for five successive weeks prior to the election.

15
16 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that Section 2 of this Act is
17 contingent on the passage of Section 1 of this Act, consisting of Charter amendments, and the
18 ratification by the voters of Baltimore County; and if such passage and ratification does not
19 occur, Section 2 of this Act shall be null and void with no further action required by the County
20 Council.

1 SECTION ~~3.~~ 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that upon ratification by the voters
2 of Baltimore County, this Act shall become effective from and after the thirtieth day following
3 the 2026 general election.
