AN ACT concerning

Restrictions on Parking Commercial Vehicles in the Essex Commercial Revitalization
District

FOR the purpose of prohibiting the parking of certain commercial vehicles in certain areas of
the Essex Commercial Revitalization District; and generally relating to parking.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County read as follows:

8 § 18-2-214. Parking Commercial Vehicles in a Commercial Revitalization District.

9 (a) A person may not park a commercial vehicle having more than three quarters of a ton
10 manufacturer's rating capacity on the following streets:

11 (1) In the Dundalk Commercial Revitalization District: Shipping Place, Center
12 Place, Commerce Street, Trading Place, N. Center Place, S. Center Place, and Dunmanway;
13 [and]

14 (2) In the Arbutus Commercial Revitalization District: Southwestern Boulevard;
15 AND

16 (3) IN THE ESSEX COMMERCIAL REVITALIZATION DISTRICT:
17 EASTERN BOULEVARD, WEST OF ITS INTERSECTION WITH N. MARLYN AVENUE
18 AND S. MARLYN AVENUE.

19 (b) A vehicle parked in violation of this section is subject to a fine of \$500 for each day a
20 violation exists.

21 (c) This section does not apply to a commercial vehicle otherwise legally parked for a
22 period essential to the immediate use of the vehicle if the vehicle is owned or contracted by a
23 public service company as that term is defined in Section 1-101(x) of the Public Utilities Article

1 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by
4 the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect 14 days from the
5 date of its enactment.
