

Program Description

The State Archives is Maryland's central depository for government records of permanent value and is one of the largest state archival organizations in the country. Its holdings date from the State's founding in 1634 and include key assets such as Maryland's colonial and State executive, legislative, and judicial records; State and county publications, reports, probate, land, and court records; business and church records; and special collections of maps, newspapers, and photographs as well as private papers from individuals.

The State Archives is also the official custodian of over 3,500 valuable paintings and other decorative arts owned by or loaned to the State and provides for these items' acquisition, preservation, and proper care – an endeavor that accounts for nearly 400,000 cubic feet of collected material. In addition, the agency provides access to key public records online and via its headquarters in Annapolis.

Fiscal 2023 Budget Increases \$271,691, or 3.0%, to \$9.2 Million



Fiscal 2023 Overview of Agency Spending

As depicted in **Exhibit 1**, the State Archives budget largely consists of personnel spending (72%). Other significant allocations are for rent and insurance costs (11%), with contractual, office, and utility spending making up the remainder.

Proposed Budget Change

As shown in Exhibit 2, the fiscal 2023 allowance for the State Archives increases by 3.0%, or \$271,691, from the fiscal 2022 working appropriation.


Key Observations

1. State Archives: Overview and Performance Measures

Physical and Electronic Archive Collections Continue to Grow

During each fiscal year, the State Archives determines which local and State records are of permanent value. From artwork and historical papers to citizen and government records, the agency collects and maintains these records and items on behalf of the State. Since fiscal 2017, the total number of both physical and electronic archives has continued to grow and is comprised of 23.6 billion data base records, 162,390 gigabytes of electronic data, and over 402,000 cubic feet of space, as illustrated in **Exhibit 3**.

Fiscal 2017-2022 Est.



The Maryland State Archives Art Collection

The Maryland Commission on Artistic Property serves the public as the official custodian of the State's art collection. The collection is comprised of works that document the history of Maryland through subject, maker, or place of origin. The State Archives added five new pieces to the art collection and placed seven additional items on display in fiscal 2021, as shown in **Exhibit 4**.

Fiscal 2017-2022 Est.



State Archives Public Programs

To keep the public aware and informed about new art installments and other items of cultural significance, the State Archives has a variety of public programs. The State Archives holds multiple lecture series and focused programs such as the *Legacy of Slavery in Maryland*. In addition, the State Archives offers genealogical sessions to assist family history researchers and conducts tours of the State House, Government House, and the State Archives buildings. **Exhibit 5** outlines the number of programs offered each year. Starting in fiscal 2020 and continuing through 2022, the number of programs has been impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. **The State Archives should comment on whether consideration is being given to expansion of online access and programming considering the decline in more traditional program opportunities during the pandemic.**
